This inspiring feedback comes from one of the students registered in the 2024-2025 Youth Employment Scheme (YES) program. Students from year 11 – year 13 (2024) had the opportunity to pair up with a business for work experience over the school holidays and wrapped up their employment in time for the start of the 2025 school year.

As part of the program requirements, students and businesses were asked to complete and submit evaluation forms to the Niue Chamber of Commerce (NCOC). The primary purpose of these evaluations was to assess the program's effectiveness, identify areas for improvement, and inform future programming decisions.







Overall, both students and businesses expressed satisfaction with the YES program. Students gained valuable work experience through their placements in the private sector, while businesses provided meaningful learning opportunities and hands-on experience within their respective industries.





I.T. WORKSHOP IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR SPACE

BEGINNERS WEBSITE DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP

NIUE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE & NIUE NATIONAL DESIGNATED AUTHORITY PARTNERSHIP

Niue's Readiness Programme Project Manager Annmarie Aholima, presented to the Niue Chamber of Commerce the recently launched Strategic Framework and Country Programme (SFCP), Readiness Needs Assessment, and Standard Operating Procedure, authored by the Greenwork Team.

These documents are a culmination of contributions from the different stakeholders, donors, development partners and community voices.

The Niue Chamber of Commerce represents Niue's private sector and along with many of the voices of our businesses contributed to the published documents.

The working partnership continues as we work towards building our private sector capacity to engage in climate finance activity and progress on the Private Sector Options Paper that was developed under the previous Readiness Project.

It is acknowledged that the private sector plays a key role in supporting the Government of Niue to build an economy that is resilient to the increasing impacts of climate change, especially so in the main private sector industries of agriculture, fisheries and tourism.



Through the Readiness program the work is ongoing to build the understanding of pathways for the private sector within the Green Climate Fund, and to strengthen the regulatory framework to create an enabling regulatory environment for Niue's private sector to engage in climate finance activities.

The Niue Chamber of Commerce looks forward to completing and launching its Private Sector Climate Finance Strategy and Action Plan.

This initiative aims to create clear pathways for accessing essential support to help our private sector build resilience against the impacts of climate change at ground roots level.

Together with Niue's NDA we strive for a more sustainable and resilient future for Niue's businesses and communities.

Charlotte Magatogia's Experience in the JENESYS 2024 Program

Japan-East Asia Network of Exchange for Students and Youths



Niue Chamber of Commerce's (NCOC) Finance, Marketing & Membership Coordinator, Charlotte Magatogia, recently had the opportunity to participate in the JENESYS 2024 program. Charlotte's involvement comes as a student of the University of the South Pacific's (USP) regional Niue campus, where NCOC has supported her studies since she began her employment in 2022. The JENESYS program provides a valuable platform for professional development and networking within the Pacific region, with the potential to benefit Niue's private sector in the future. Here, Charlotte shares her experience and insights from the program.

JENESYS is a youth exchange initiative launched by the Japanese government to strengthen relations between Japan and other countries, particularly in the Asia-Pacific region. The program fosters mutual understanding, cultural exchange, and cooperation by inviting young participants from across the Pacific to Japan for study tours, cultural experiences, and discussions on topics such as technology, economics, and diplomacy. Activities typically include homestays, university visits, company tours, and cultural immersion, all aimed at building stronger connections between Japan and the Pacific.

From January 29, 2025, I had the incredible opportunity to participate in JENESYS 2024 cohort as a student from USP's Niue Campus. With a focus on disaster prevention, our itinerary took us across Tokyo and into the Saitama Prefecture, where we explored Japan's world-leading disaster preparedness strategies. Learning about Japan's risk management frameworks, resilient infrastructure, and the role of the private sector in disaster recovery was particularly insightful. These approaches offer valuable lessons that can contribute to strengthening resilience within Niue's business community.

Beyond disaster prevention, the program also allowed me to engage with Japanese businesses, government agencies, and fellow participants from the Pacific region, expanding my professional network and deepening my understanding of international business. Observing how Japan integrates the private sector and their community into disaster resilience efforts has given me new perspectives that I can apply in my work.


One of the most enriching aspects of the program was the homestay experience in Chichibu City. My host family's warmth and hospitality reinforced the importance of cultural exchange and relationship-building, making this experience especially meaningful.


